Playing Assignments

- Real time Schedules & results are reported through <u>Advanced Event Systems</u> (www.advancedeventsystems.com). The <u>AES Express App</u> is available for iPhone, Android and Blackberry. This information is also available through links <u>ON OUR WEB SITE</u>. There is FREE wireless access in the Convention Center Metro Marche food court area. FREE COMPUTER TERMINALS and RESULTS BOARDS are located near the tournament desks.
- The **Flow Chart** provides playing assignments. It is necessary to know the seed number of your team going into each round of play to determine your assignment (See page 9 for an example).

Clarification of Playing Assignments Coaches:

 The Age Group Director at the tournament desks can help explain any concerns about assignments. The Court Managers can direct coaches to the appropriate person to get assistance in finding their court assignment.

Parents and Spectators:







PARKING GARAGE DIRECTIONS

- **Jefferson Garage** 333 E. Jefferson St. \$5/day, no in & out privileges. Pre-buy reserved parking online at ParkWhiz to take advantage of this special Volleyball Festival rate. Otherwise special event rates apply. This above ground parking structure is located directly south of the South Building of the Phoenix Convention Center, with entrances on the east, west and south sides. Note Jefferson Street is one-way going east; Third Street is one-way going south.
- Regency Garage 40 N. 2nd St. \$12/day, no in & out privileges.
 This garage is located directly across Second Street from the West Building between Washington and Adams streets.
- East Garage 601 E. Washington St. \$9/day, with printed daily COUPON, no in & out privileges. This above ground parking structure is the largest in the area and is located directly east of the South Building and southeast of the North Building. Entrances are available off of Washington (one-way westbound) and Jefferson (one-way eastbound) streets.
- **Heritage Garage** 123 N. 5th St. \$12/day, no in & out privileges. This garage is located next to Heritage Square and the Phoenix Museum of History, just east of the North Building. Enter this garage from Fifth or Monroe streets.
- West Garage -185 N. 2nd St. \$12/day, no in & out privileges. Enter the underground parking in the West Building of the Phoenix Convention Center off of Second Street, just south of Monroe Street. It is directly across Second Street from the Hyatt Regency Hotel.
- **North Garage** 475 E. Monroe St. \$12/day, no in & out privileges. This garage is located below the North Building. Enter this garage from Monroe Street, just west of Fifth Street.

Festival Format

The tournament is organized around the re-seeding of each team at the end of each round of play. This re-seeding sorts teams into progressive groupings where opponents are of similar abilities. As each team approaches the end of the Festival, each team has an increasing opportunity to be successful.

Seeding Procedures

Based on teams' records of achievement in their region and in other regional tournaments, self-seeding information, and any other pertinent information, teams have been assigned to pools for the first day.

Avoiding Intra-regional Play

Every effort is made to avoid placing teams from the same region into the same pool on the first day of play. This is not always possible.

Finding Out When Teams Play


A team locator is posted on the results board near the tournament desks listing each team's first assignment for that day. A coach can also follow the progress of his or her team using the flow chart because it includes the court assignment number alongside each pool.

Scoring System

- Standard matches: 2 sets to 25 and if necessary, 3rd set to 15.
- 3 Team pools play 3 sets to 25, if not followed by a crossover match.
- No cap in any set.
- **Tie breaking sets**: one 25-point set with no cap.

Understanding the Festival Flow Chart

Each age group has its own flow chart. The flow chart is a map that details how teams progress through the tournament. The flow chart shows where each team begins the tournament, where the team will go if it maintains its seed, which teams remain in contention for the Championship Division, and where a team will go if its performance results in a change of seed. By using the flow chart, you can track your team's progress throughout the tournament and see the possibilities for the next day and the rest of the tournament. (See next page.)



AVOIDING CONFUSION

- COACHES: STUDY the TOURNAMENT HANDBOOK and FLOW CHART so that you understand where you play, when you play, and when you are scheduled to referee, so you can avoid being assessed penalty points or forfeits.
- COACHES: SIGN the POOL SHEET indicating you agree with your next day's assignment. You should check the seed you have been assigned with the results of your pool or bracket. Follow that seed to the next round of competition on the Flow Chart to make sure your team has been assigned to the correct position for the next day's competition.
- If you find any **DISCREPANCIES** in your assignment for the next round, consult the court manager. The referees are not expected to make decisions about your next day's assignment. If you want further clarification, contact your Age Group Director, so your situation can be reviewed.

OFFICIAL PROTESTS

- Made during the match must be made before the next ball is served.
- Made on the last point of game 1 or 2 must be made within the first 60 seconds of the 3 minutes between games.
- Made on the last point of the match must be made before the referee leaves the court.
- In spite of all of the careful planning and training that goes into preparing for the Festival, each year in a very few cases, Festival staff members commit errors when advising teams about a team's assignments for the next day. Every effort is made to avoid errors and where possible to correct them in a fair and just manner. However, THE BEST WAY TO GUARD AGAINST STAFF ERRORS made in interpreting the playing schedule is for the coaches to master the TOURNAMENT HANDBOOK so that the coaches can challenge incorrect interpretations of a team's progress.

SAFETY AND SECURITY

Securing Possessions

- Assign a member of your team to be in charge of securing possessions.
- Put all possessions in a place where they are visible to members of vour team community.
- Attend possessions at all times.
- Leave valuables secured at your place of residence.

Staying Safe While Walking

- Always walk in groups of two or more.
- Carry a cell phone.
- Dress comfortably, but modestly.
- Report any suspicious behavior to the Festival Staff, Police,
 Phoenix Convention Center Security, or Downtown Phoenix Ambassadors (orange shirts).

Hotel Room Safety

- Always lock and bolt your door.
- Do not open the door until you are sure you know who you are admitting. USE DOOR PEEP HOLES AND SECURITY CHAINS to monitor who is seeking entry.
- Players should always travel in pairs, even to the ice machine.
- Familiarize yourself with Hotel Front Desk and Security phone

numbers.

 If accosted by a stranger or anyone, RETREAT and IMMEDIATELY CALL FOR HELP.

Seeking Help

- Be sure that someone in your group has a **cell phone** at all times.
- Maintain your position via your phones GPS capabilities.
